FACILITIES

Laboratory

Laboratories at the Ubaya is an academic implementing element formed by the Rector to support the needs of the study program and is an association of scientists (scholars) who carry out academic activities in realizing the Vision and Mission of the study program. The Ubaya Faculty of Law has 5 (five) laboratories led by a head of the laboratory, namely:

Moot Court Room

It is a place for student training in the litigation field for all types of cases as well as practice for students in the Legal Proficiency Education and Training (PLKH) subject to become professional practitioners.

English Course

The quality of graduates is complemented by English language skills with English Language course until they meet a minimum TOEFL score of > 400 as well as a prerequisite for submitting students' final thesis according to the Specialization program they take.

Legal Clinic

This clinic is a supporting facility to hone students' skills in practicing law, especially in making legal documents (deed of agreement, deed of inheritance, formation of statutory regulations, and other documents).

Special Collection

It is a faculty library to support legal education in the form of literature, articles, journal papers, research, and laws and regulations that support the deepening of legal understanding, both National and International Law.

Legal Media

In order to accommodate scientific ideas about the law that are continuously developing for academics and other legal experts, FH Ubaya publishes the Yustika Journal, the Argumentum Journal, and the Minuta Journal published twice every year.

Legal Aid Bureau (BBH)

This is one of the community engagement activities that provides legal assistance and legal counseling for the community/justice seekers.

Legal Service Office (KLH)

It is a forum for the realization of the University-Industry linkage, whose activities include:

- Consultation on business law, banking law, labor law, intellectual property rights/copyrights, patents, and trademarks.
- ✓ Training related to business law.
- ✓ Seminars and short courses.
- ✓ Negotiation and mediation.
- Litigation in: civil, criminal, and administrative/labor law.
