The Faculty of Psychology was established in 1982. Since 1996 until now, the Faculty of Psychology has received "A" accreditation. The last "A" accreditation was ratified on BAN-PT Decree No. 11214/SK/BAN-PT/Ak-PPJ/S/IX/2021. In addition, the Faculty of Psychology also received international certification from the ASEAN University Network-Quality Assurance (AUN-QA) No. AP418UBAYAMAY19 in 2019. Psychology education at Ubaya has followed the development of Psychology education in Indonesia, although it still has its colors and characteristics that are inseparable from Ubaya's Vision and Mission.

Faculty of Psychology Ubaya has a vision: **“To be an excellent education institution in psychology based on scientific endeavour and to apply life values in managing urban problems”** This vision encourages the Faculty to become an institution that excels in scientific development and makes a real contribution through the application of psychology for human benefit.

CURRICULAR & CO-CURRICULAR

The Faculty of Psychology implements the University Curriculum (KPT), oriented toward Learning Outcomes. The implementation of KPT is in line with DIKTI policy and the Association of Indonesian Higher Education Organizers in Psychology (AP2TPI). Ubaya Bachelor of Psychology Learning Outcomes are:

1. Basic theory of psychology and its application,
2. Psychology research methods,
3. Development of psychological measurement tools,
4. Psychological assessment,
5. Psychological intervention,
6. Applied theory, research methods, and measurement tools,
7. Psychological assessment and intervention in the urban context (family, school, industrial-organizational, and urban community settings).

The Learning Outcomes of graduates' soft skills are as follows:

1. Self-management,
2. Thinking skills,
3. Lifelong learning,
4. Communication,
5. Teamwork,
6. Ability to interact in diversity,
7. Integrity,

Opportunities to develop soft skills and the application of psychology are also facilitated through peer group activities in Clinical Psychology, Educational Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Industrial and Organizational Psychology, Social Psychology, and General Psychology laboratories. Students also have the opportunity to be involved in strategic activity unit projects:

1. Gender and Reproductive Health Study Group (KSGK)
2. Center for Life Long Learning (CL2)
3. Disaster Psychology Study Group (KSPB)

The development of graduates' soft skills is also carried out through curricular programs with Student-centered learning and co-curricular (supporting programs outside of lectures and conducted beyond the classroom). In the learning process, students are also allowed to participate in various forms of the Independent Learning-Independent Campus (MBKM), such as student exchange programs, internships, humanitarian projects, research, independent projects, and entrepreneurship. MBKM is intended to enable students to experience learning in real-world situations or social life. The co-curricular program is compulsory for students to participate in and is divided into three phases:

1. Growth Phase: Exploring Myself Camp (Semester II)
2. Development Phase: Self-Help Camp (Semester IV)
3. Maturation Phase: Live-In (Semester VI)

STUDY LOAD

The Ubaya Faculty of Psychology Undergraduate study load is 144 credits with a normal study period of 8 semesters.

LECTURERS

The Faculty of Psychology lecturers are 41 permanent lecturers consisting of 27 Doctors (2 of whom are professors) and 14 Masters (5 of whom are currently studying for doctoral degrees).
